The Dinuba QuickHealth will be open seven days a week; from 9AM to 7PM Monday through Saturday, and from 10AM to 6PM on Sunday. Customers can drop in to QuickHealth at their convenience; no appointment is necessary. Services are delivered in both Spanish and English by a bilingual staff.

QuickHealth doctors accept cash, checks, debit cards, and major credit cards. A receipt form is provided if customers wish to pursue insurance reimbursement on their own.
